

Civil Protection Orders

There are two (2) statutes that a petitioner can file under. A petitioner can file under one or both statutes, if applicable

Domestic Violence ID Code § 39-6304

(A) To obtain a Civil Protection Order for Domestic Violence, you and the respondent must have, or have had, a specific kind of relationship, such as:

- **Currently or previously married**
- **Currently or previously dating**
- **Currently are or formerly were intimate partners**
- **Currently or formerly lived together**
- **You and the respondent share a child in common**
- **Being related by blood, marriage, or adoption**

(B) Experienced an act or threat of:

- **Physical injury**
- **Sexual Abuse**
- **Forced Imprisonment**

Malicious Harassment ID Code § 18-7907

(A) Within the last 90 days, the respondent has engaged in repeated, non-consensual acts against you:

- **Stalking - repeated forms of non-consensual contact that alarms, annoys, harasses, or scares you and causes emotional distress, fear of death, or fear of injury**
- **Telephone Threats - threats of physical injury or harm that are made with the intent to terrify, threaten, or intimidate you**
- **Threats Based on Race, Color, Religion, Ancestry, or National Origin - acts of intimidation, threats, harassment, or physical injury to the victim or victim's property**
