Transgender Voting Rights in Idaho

Don't let concerns keep you from voting!

To be a successful Trans voter, make sure to do the following:

- Register and vote using your current legal name
- Plan on re-registering to vote at your county elections office when you are changing your name and ID. (You may change your gender marker for demographic purposes)
- Register to vote 25 days prior to the election either by mail or register in-person on Election Day
- Verify your voter registration status
- Identify your polling place and note the hours of operation
- Make sure to bring a photo identification card with your current legal name or be prepared to sign the Personal Identification Affidavit

Voting Scenarios:

- If your ID and polling records match, you should have no issue
- If you have a new photo ID but your registration is in your old name, you will need to re-register at the polling place using your new ID
- If your photo doesn't match your presentation, don't worry, you may be asked to sign the Personal Identification Affidavit. Your vote will still count.
